

KAESLER

Cabernet Sauvignon 2004

At Kaesler we have 3 Cabernet Vineyards; two on the original Kaesler farm, and one from Barrington's, over the main road from Kaesler. Barrington's was purchased in 2003.

The soil type on all the sites is red brown loam over clay and then over limestone rubble and is perfectly suited for Cabernet Sauvignon. The clay builds the fruit and strength into the wine, and limestone the finer tannins.

The wine was neither fined nor filtered.

Colour: Ruby and dense garnet.

Nose: Strong up-front blackberry and liquorice. Not as much mocha and coffee previous years due to less new oak. Old fashioned in style.

Palate: Firm tannin, dark berries, intense with a long finish.

Notes The 2004 Cabernet is massive and can best be described as a fruit bomb. This variety is seriously under rated in Barossa. Our 2002 won gold in Melbourne and Cowra and also got 5 stars in Winestate, and whilst I hate banging on about the shows, I can't help it with this wine. The 2004 is in the same mould.



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
